Awards Dinner: Linda reminded everyone that the Awards Dinner is Saturday, February 5th. 5 PM Drinks, 6 PM Dinner & 7 PM Awards. 65 people are expected to attend.

K9 Closet: Cindy told everyone of items that were marked down on sale (from current inventory and not from order).

Senior Dog Day: Jackie announced there will be a 2nd Annual Senior Dog Day on February 13th from 10 AM – 2 PM. There will be various booths for dogs to participate in and a senior dog is defined by the breed. New this year will be Magna Wave Therapy for a fee. Additionally, there will be an animal communicator available for a fee as well. Jackie asked for volunteers to make desserts and receive 2 volunteer hours.

Yard Passes: Mike & Linda Allen reminded everyone to get their new yard pass this year. You must be a member to use the pass. The pass must be displayed in window off the mirror. If the yard is muddy or if there is an event at the club, the yard will be locked. If you are taking classes at the club, you can use the yard ½ hour before & ½ hour after.

Agility: Friday, February 4th will be run throughs at 6 pm for \$5 and you will receive two, 2-minute runs. The novice agility trial will be held March 5 & 6th. ACT runs will be Saturday AM. Sign up for volunteering on-line.

Class Registration: Spring classes begin the week of March 7th. Waitlist students are currently signing up. Continuing students begin signing up the week of February 7th and the general public can begin registering on February 14th.

Canine CPR: There will be a Canine CPR Class on May 7th from 8 AM – 12 PM. Member cost is \$35. There will be a Canine CPR Review Class on March 19 from 9-11:30 AM. The review class will be more hands on, and you can bring your dog to practice on. Only 6 spots left, and masks will be required.

Old Business: The Memorial Wall is ready, and the form is now available online. A question was asked about why the fencing around the garbage was removed. It will be put back up in the summer. It was removed for the new garbage collection agency and with the frozen ground it is difficult to reinstall until the ground thaws.

New Business:

It was suggested that a potty area be created when someone is using the yard. Jon will look into that. Charlene mentioned that the intercom system seems to be left on and the batteries die and need to be replaced often. She is hoping everyone can remember to turn off the intercom system and flip the switch off after every use.

BOARD MEETING MINUTES – February 17th, 2022

Meeting called to order.

Present: Margie Hohman, Tracey Rymer, Marie Murphy, Jackie Kobierecki, Penney Garbe, Chelsea Wood, Barb Hoffman

Guests: Darcy Bicking, Suzzane Hitter, Judy Massey, and Jon Kester

Darcy brought up adding signage to the doors letting individuals know that dogs are working off leash and if she can use the signs. A discussion occurred about locking the doors when keeping dogs off leash and it was thought that it was a potential fire code violation. Barb will be calling the fire department to verify. The signs were approved to be used on the doors, but it was also strongly suggested that she use a partition in front of the door to keep dogs from running in and out of the building if someone does not see the sign. Darcy also asked if members could sign up for open floor on wejoin without providing their name. Chelsea will look into a service to book wejoin without providing a name.

Suzzane Hitter requested if there was a way to signal if other dogs could join a member and their dog in the yard. A flag was discussed but it was determined if it was forgotten and someone allowed their dog into the area based on the flag, there could be misunderstandings and possibly a dog fight. It was suggested that Suzzane and others attend the membership meetings and socialize after the meeting to find other members that may wish to have their dogs play together in the yard.

Judy Massey discussed with the board regarding dog poop tools that she bought for the club and the process for donating items like that. It was stated that the building committee must be notified, and a discussion should result.

Jon Kester suggested to the board that we should consider guidelines for building use such as open floor rentals, drop in classes, and sign in when entering the building regardless of reason. It was also discussed that agility equipment and other equipment are being utilized by the members and some members do not know how to properly use or set up the equipment.

The board decided to set up a separate meeting to discuss this at another date. Jon also brought up that there seems to be some inconsistency in payment for active members in floor rentals vs scheduled class vs drop in classes. The board will look at setting up a policy. It was made aware that not everyone knows the definition of an active member or member at the club. Margie will discuss this at the next membership meeting.

Secretary's Report: Tracey mentioned this past weekend the first aid kit was needed and upon opening, found that the kit was severely depleted, as well as the dog first aid kit. She will contact Len and let him know. Additionally, a question was raised if the training email could be added to the voice mail message so that individuals can submit questions that way as well. Marie will be providing Tracey with the script and the voicemail will be recorded to include the email address. Tracey handed out the 2021 motions and key decision document for everyone to review and get back to her with any changes.

Treasurer's Report: The annual audit report meeting is complete. Marie reported we are still due monies for trophy donations from the Winter show. She will be sending out past due notices. Marie mentioned the room rental for Stone Toad is going up substantially next year. We will be discussing with membership about switching to a summer picnic at the club. Marie stated that next year there will be 13 new Lifetime members so Marie suggested getting a quote from J. Anthony Jewelers to order more silver 25-year pins.

President's Report: Marge discussed that we are looking into a potty area for dogs, and it was suggested to move the back fence in 20 feet. This will be discussed with the building committee.

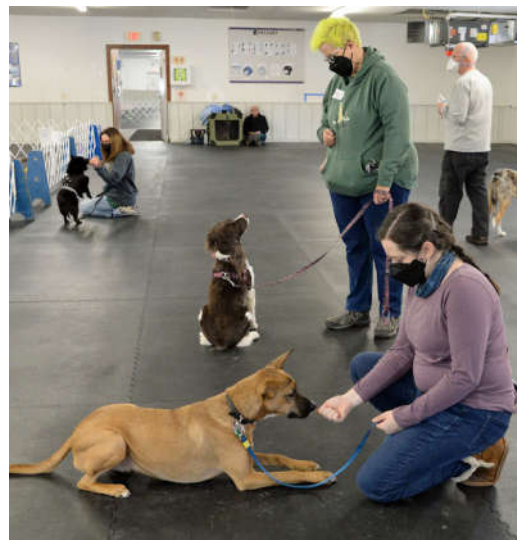

The purpose of the Canine good Citizen Test is to ensure that our favorite companion, the dog, can be a respected member of the community because it is trained and conditioned to act mannerly in the home, in public places and in the presence of other dogs. The program embraces both purebred and mixed-breed dogs, as the anti-canine sentiment does not discriminate between the purebred and the non-purebred.

Canine Good Citizen training is fun and useful. Through it, you and your dog will establish a closer bond and your dog will have the added benefit of knowing how to please you. This test of your dog's manners and training is not a competition and does not require that you and your dog perform with precision.

The Canine Good Citizen program is based on the concept that all dogs should have enough basic training to be under control at home and in public.

The American Kennel club urges all dog owners to participate in this program, thereby assuring that our beloved dogs will always be welcomed and respected members of the community.

All dogs who pass the ten items on the CGC test earn a certificate from the AKC.

Dogs should wear well-fitting buckle or slip collars made of either leather, fabric or chain.

Special training collars, such as pinch collars or Gentle Leaders, are not acceptable.

UPDATE: As of November 2010, use of harnesses is allowed during testing. Loose leash rules still apply.

DEMONSTRATING CONFIDENCE AND CONTROL, THE DOG AND HANDLER MUST SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE THESE 10 STEPS.

TEST EXERCISES

1. Accepting a friendly stranger
2. Sitting politely for petting
3. Appearance and grooming
4. Out for a walk
(walking on a loose leash)
5. Walking through a crowd
6. Sit and down on command/
staying in place
7. Coming when called
8. Reaction to another dog
9. Reaction to distractions
10. Supervised separation

YARD USE GUIDELINES

- You must be an APPROVED CLUB MEMBER to use the yard. As an approved member, you can bring a guest into the yard, family members cannot use the yard if you are not present unless you have a Household membership. A yard permit must be obtained from the WDC Yard Pass Chairperson after you are approved as a member and renewed annually. You must have the WDC Yard Permit prominently displayed hanging from your vehicle's rear-view mirror when using the yard. If you arrive at the club, either walking or on a bicycle/other vehicle, you must have the pass with you.
- Individuals enrolled in a club training class have exclusive use the yard during the ½ hour before or after their class. Please give priority to class participants.
- If someone is using the yard when you arrive, ASK PERMISSION to bring your dog in.
- If you are using the yard and choose not to have other dogs enter the yard LIMIT YOUR USE TIME to 15 minutes.
- If the yard is occupied, DO NOT PARK WITHIN 60 FEET OF THE YARD FENCE. Park near the light pole while waiting.
- Please have your dogs on a leash while entering and leaving the yard on the way to your vehicle. DO NOT use a long line while in the yard.
- Pick up your dog's waste and dispose of it in the containers provided.
- The training center is available for rental. If it is rented this includes the yard. A sign will be posted on the gate.
- Occasionally the yard will be saturated with standing water. The yard will be closed for safety reasons. This will be posted on the gate.

2022 WDC YARD PASSES ARE READY!!

- ▼ A 2022 Yard Pass is required to use the Club's front and back fenced yards.
- ▼ The new Yard Passes are black and yellow, and they are to be placed in the clear plastic hanging pockets. So, don't throw away the plastic hangers. Take out the old 2021 Yard Pass and place the new red and white passes in the hanger. The plastic hangers are to hang from your rear-view mirror. If you bike or walk to the club, carry the hanging pocket pass with you.
- ▼ **Family** Memberships may have **two FREE passes**. **Single** memberships may have **one FREE pass**. Extra passes are \$1.00 each and extra plastic hangers are \$2.00 each. If your pass is damaged or stolen, replacement passes can be obtained for \$3.00 fee (pass \$1.00 and hangers \$2.00). If you get a new license plate number, you will need to get a new pass. The passes will change yearly. **ALL CLUB MEMBERS MUST HAVE PASSES BY MAY 1.**
- ▼ We need your help – please help enforce the yard-use policy! Look at the cars for the people using the fenced yards. If someone using the yard doesn't have a yard pass, please courteously ask him or her if they are WDC members. If they are not members, tell them the yards are for **MEMBERS ONLY** and tell them how they can become WDC members.
