Canine Good Citizen/Trick Dog: Jolene Johnson announced that the Canine Good Citizen testing will be held April 23rd from 9 am – 12 pm. Trick Dog testing will also be done at this time. There are many volunteer opportunities available.

Yard Passes: Linda Allen reminded everyone that if you are an approved member, you can get a yard pass. You can apply at a membership meeting or fill out the form in the newsletter. When the yard is muddy, there may be notices that should be followed.

Fast CAT: Linda Allen announced that WDC will be holding a Fast CAT trial at the Oshkosh Kennel Club August 19-21.

Wall Plaques: Achievements that your dog has made from January 1, 2021 – December 31, 2021, can be submitted to have your dog's name and achievement on a plaque to be hung on the club wall. Form is available on the website and should be submitted by March 31st.

Director of Training:

Chelsea Wood reported that the documentation of immunization status of the dogs registered for classes was very time consuming and at times difficult due to information provided. The board discussed clarification of which immunizations are requested. It was felt that for the safety of all dogs, dogs registering for Basic Manners are required to have documentation for receiving immunization for Canine Distemper and Rabies. All other classes will require documentation of current immunization for Rabies.

This information will be requested at the orientation program or the Wednesday prior to the start of classes. Failure to provide documentation will result in dogs not permitted to participate in class.

Old Business:

The current policy on the use of masks by individuals in classes/events was discussed. At this time, the board recommended to continue current policy of leaving the decision at the discretion of the instructor. Margie asked the status of shirts for instructors. There was no information on that initiative. Penney then requested that the board provide vests that members could wear for events sponsored by the club. Cindy Veit, K-9 Klost Comm Chair, will be asked to look into obtaining/availability/cost of vests that would be available for member use.

Changes to the process of securing and access of agility and obedience/rally equipment is in process. The equipment has been organized, lockboxes installed and education of designated members is underway. The goal is to have this completed by the next membership meeting on April 7. The criteria for access is one of the following: currently competing or has competed in the sport, completion of a Novice course in the sport or Inservice provided by committee chair.

The lockboxes will have specific codes for each area and will be changed as determined by the board.

New Business:

Marie reported on a request by a member to have Face Book sub-group for WDC members to ask for advice, sell supplies, share info. The board declined to establish another Face Book group at this time.

The board recommended that snacks will be provided at the membership meeting. 1 hour volunteer time can be earned for providing refreshments.

The board requested that Library resources be available to the members at the monthly meeting. Self-checkout of library materials will be implemented.

Due to the success and positive feedback, the board discussed having an annual picnic. The question was raised if this should replace the Appreciation Dinner held each February. This question will be presented at the April membership meeting

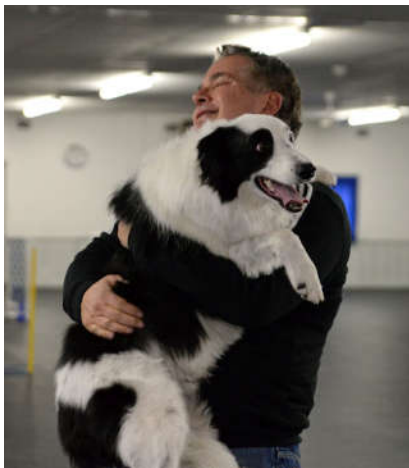

TRICK DOG TITLE INFO

- AKC Trick Dog titles are official AKC titles listed on the dog's title record.
- The processing fee for each title is \$25. Multiple titles for the same dog can be sent in together, each one will be processed in succession after each previous title has been added and printed.
- Dogs must have an AKC, PAL, or AKC Canine Partners number to earn a title.
- All dogs can get a number, including purebreds and mixed breeds.

5 TRICK DOG TITLES

Novice Trick Dog (TKN)

The dog performs 10 skills from the Novice list. If a dog has a Canine Good Citizen (CGC) certificate or title on record at AKC, it can do 5 Novice tricks (CGC + 5) to earn the Novice title.

Intermediate Trick Dog (TKI)

The dog must have the Novice title, plus perform 10 Intermediate tricks.

Advanced Trick Dog (TKA)

The dog must have the Intermediate title, plus perform 10 tricks from the Advanced list.

Trick Dog Performer (TKP)

In this title, handlers perform a short routine with at least 10 tricks previously learned.

Trick Dog Elite Performer (TKE)

Testing of this truly elite trick dog level requires the dog to perform 10 tricks with at least 5 props and there must be a story.

The purpose of the Canine good Citizen Test is to ensure that our favorite companion, the dog, can be a respected member of the community because it is trained and conditioned to act mannerly in the home, in public places and in the presence of other dogs. The program embraces both purebred and mixed-breed dogs, as the anti-canine sentiment does not discriminate between the purebred and the non-purebred.

Canine Good Citizen training is fun and useful. Through it, you and your dog will establish a closer bond and your dog will have the added benefit of knowing how to please you. This test of your dog's manners and training is not a competition and does not require that you and your dog perform with precision.

The Canine Good Citizen program is based on the concept that all dogs should have enough basic training to be under control at home and in public.

The American Kennel club urges all dog owners to participate in this program, thereby assuring that our beloved dogs will always be welcomed and respected members of the community.

All dogs who pass the ten items on the CGC test earn a certificate from the AKC.

Dogs should wear well-fitting buckle or slip collars made of either leather, fabric or chain.

Special training collars, such as pinch collars or Gentle Leaders, are not acceptable.

UPDATE: As of November 2010, use of harnesses is allowed during testing. Loose leash rules still apply.

DEMONSTRATING CONFIDENCE AND CONTROL, THE DOG AND HANDLER MUST SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE THESE 10 STEPS.

TEST EXERCISES

1. Accepting a friendly stranger
2. Sitting politely for petting
3. Appearance and grooming
4. Out for a walk
(walking on a loose leash)
5. Walking through a crowd
6. Sit and down on command/
staying in place
7. Coming when called
8. Reaction to another dog
9. Reaction to distractions
10. Supervised separation

YARD USE GUIDELINES

- You must be an APPROVED CLUB MEMBER to use the yard. As an approved member, you can bring a guest into the yard, family members cannot use the yard if you are not present unless you have a Household membership. A yard permit must be obtained from the WDC Yard Pass Chairperson after you are approved as a member and renewed annually. You must have the WDC Yard Permit prominently displayed hanging from your vehicle's rear-view mirror when using the yard. If you arrive at the club, either walking or on a bicycle/other vehicle, you must have the pass with you.
- Individuals enrolled in a club training class have exclusive use the yard during the ½ hour before or after their class. Please give priority to class participants.
- If someone is using the yard when you arrive, ASK PERMISSION to bring your dog in.
- If you are using the yard and choose not to have other dogs enter the yard LIMIT YOUR USE TIME to 15 minutes.
- If the yard is occupied, DO NOT PARK WITHIN 60 FEET OF THE YARD FENCE. Park near the light pole while waiting.
- Please have your dogs on a leash while entering and leaving the yard on the way to your vehicle. DO NOT use a long line while in the yard.
- Pick up your dog's waste and dispose of it in the containers provided.
- The training center is available for rental. If it is rented this includes the yard. A sign will be posted on the gate.
- Occasionally the yard will be saturated with standing water. The yard will be closed for safety reasons. This will be posted on the gate.

2022 WDC YARD PASSES ARE READY!!

- ▼ A 2022 Yard Pass is required to use the Club's front and back fenced yards.
- ▼ The new Yard Passes are black and yellow, and they are to be placed in the clear plastic hanging pockets. So, don't throw away the plastic hangers. Take out the old 2021 Yard Pass and place the new red and white passes in the hanger. The plastic hangers are to hang from your rear-view mirror. If you bike or walk to the club, carry the hanging pocket pass with you.
- ▼ **Family** Memberships may have **two FREE passes**. **Single** memberships may have **one FREE pass**. Extra passes are \$1.00 each and extra plastic hangers are \$2.00 each. If your pass is damaged or stolen, replacement passes can be obtained for \$3.00 fee (pass \$1.00 and hangers \$2.00). If you get a new license plate number, you will need to get a new pass. The passes will change yearly. **ALL CLUB MEMBERS MUST HAVE PASSES BY MAY 1.**
- ▼ We need your help – please help enforce the yard-use policy! Look at the cars for the people using the fenced yards. If someone using the yard doesn't have a yard pass, please courteously ask him or her if they are WDC members. If they are not members, tell them the yards are for **MEMBERS ONLY** and tell them how they can become WDC members. If someone is abusing the posted rules, give the license plate number and complaint to any board member or Linda Allen.
